#### THE PRINCIPLES OF COLLABORATIVE WORK





# STRATEGIC PLAN

**STARTING IN AUGUST 2021**, the York Opioid Collaborative embarked on a long-range strategic planning process. York Opioid Collaborative is at an interesting point in its organizational development. In 2018, when YOC engaged in its first strategic planning process, the organization was just starting out as a non-profit and the strategic plan was developed for our stakeholder coalition. It focused on the Collaborative as a coalition and objectives to be carried out among partners but did not consider YOC as a standalone organization. Despite this, the strategic plan has served as a roadmap, to drive initiatives taken on as an organization, by other organizations engaged with the Collaborative, or through partnerships. Now that we have been a non-profit for 4 years and having successfully implemented many of the tasks and objectives outlined in our 2018-2021 plan, we look to our next plan to articulate the business, financial, and programmatic strategies which the organization will pursue over the next 3 years.

We hired a consultant to provide the following services:

- 1. Work with board members, staff, and stakeholders to articulate a clear strategic plan for YOC for 2022-2024. This plan should identify specific programming, fundraising, grantmaking, communication objectives for the organization in pursuit of its mission.
- **2.** Conduct a general SWOT analysis of internal and external perceptions of organization.
- **3.** Develop a timetable of implementation with specific measurable benchmarks, objectives, and tasks to be accomplished to achieve goals.
- **4.** Establish a framework and process for the organization's leadership to effectively implement the strategic plan and monitor progress toward achievement of goals and objectives.
- **5.** Facilitate meetings and provide leadership, direction and expert consultation and advice related to the development of an effective strategic plan, including successful implementation.
- **6.** Deliverables should be a clear, easily consumed, strategic planning roadmap, accompanied by a strategic planning timeline.
- 7. Presentation of findings to the York Opioid Collaborative Board of Directors on an agreed upon date.

The process included a half-day board retreat, interviews with community stakeholders and continued work over the course of several months with the Board of Directors. ■









# **FISCAL YEAR 21-22 PROJECTS**



#### **OVERDOSE PREVENTION ASSISTANCE LOCALLY- OPAL**

The OPAL, online mail-based Narcan distribution program officially launched in October 2021. This program is designed to eliminate barriers individuals face accessing naloxone, by providing a brief online training and delivering a Narcan kit straight to their door. Since its inception, the program has reached individuals across York and Adams County.





#### **OVERDOSE 2 ACTION**

**Overdose Fatality Review Team**: The purpose of this team is to prevent overdose deaths. The team accomplishes this purpose by examining individual, organizational, and systems level factors related to overdose deaths that occur in York County, Pennsylvania. The York Opioid Collaborative convenes the Public Health Safety Team which serves as the governance committee for OFR, but also serves on the steering committee for OFR as a coordinator.

# Medication Storage and Disposal Education and Material Distribution - Safeguar(x)d:

We provide community partners medication lockbags, medication lock boxes, medication deactivation kits, and literature about proper medication storage and disposal, for distribution to individuals. The program expands the availability of these materials by working with partner agencies to engage individuals in conversations about the importance of safe storage of medications.

**Naloxone Distribution:** In partnership with City of York Bureau of Health, we held monthly naloxone distribution and overdose response training at the Bureau of Health-Health Clinic.



#### **COMMUNITY SHARPS COLLECTION PILOT DEVELOPMENT**

The work to develop a community sharps collection program continued during this fiscal year. The purpose of this project funded by the Memorial Health Fund, was to coordinate efforts between partnering agencies to develop options for safe sharps disposal for home-generate sharps and sharps used in the community.



#### **OVERDOSE RESPONSE STRATEGY PILOT**

The Overdose Response Strategy Pilot planning grant through the National Association of City and County Health Officials and the CDC Foundation supported planning work for a Multi-disciplinary post overdose outreach team. The goal of this type of outreach is to connect with individuals who experienced an overdose but did not go to the hospital. It is expanding Warm Handoff services, currently provided to those who receive transport to the hospital.



#### **MEDICATION TAKE BACK EVENTS**

We partner with local law enforcement twice a year to participate in the National Prescription Drug Take Back day. This event provides our community with a way to dispose of medication securely. It also helps to expand education to the community about the importance of safe disposal and options for year-round disposal of unused or expired medications.







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
